

APPLICATION FOR PROMOTION TO 6TH DAN GUIDANCE NOTES



The following notes have been compiled in order to assist BJA 5th Dan judoka in their application for 6th Dan and should be read in conjunction with the published application form. These promotions are awarded by the British Judo Association Board of Directors (BJA BOD) in accordance with the information detailed on the IJF grading documentation, BJA Dan Grade Syllabus and on the recommendation of the BJA Promotions Commission.

1. Applicant should complete the application form and digitally sign the application.
2. Applicant may also wish to supply an additional Curriculum Vitae (CV) with extra information.
3. The category claimed (A, B C or D) is the highest level that the judoka has obtained during their career, this activity must have been consistent over a period of time. The below table lists some of the accepted activities, as a guide as to what category a judoka may be.
4. The promotions commission recommendation will largely be based on activity since their last promotion. However, a judoka's complete judo career is taken into account.
5. Applicant must ensure they are of the correct age and time in grade in accordance with detail below. They must hold a minimum competitive grade of 3rd Dan, but in exceptional circumstance as detailed in the Dan Grade syllabus, a non-competitive or Technical 3rd Dan may be accepted. Proof of minimum BJA level 1 Kata in Nage-no-kata and Katame-no-kata must be supplied.

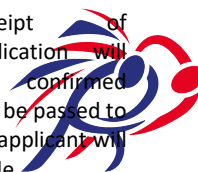
