	Risk O5: Downgraded as comprehensive Mental Health & Wellbeing Action Plan has now been produced. Next steps to look at how to implement it  Risk P3: SM has informed there is no additional funding available. Hope that IJF protocols will be relaxed after the World Championships which will relieve some pressure on the budget	
61.8	CHAIRMAN'S REMARKS	
<u> </u>	RS opened with an update on his attendance at the EJU Executive Meeting in Istanbul, where RS was appointed as the being responsible for inclusion in adaptive judo for the EJU and that a survey has been issued to member federations to stocktake on what activity was currently being undertaken.	
	RS then advised that the IJF have now publicly announced that Russian and Belarussian athletes have been banned from all events up to the end of the calendar year.	
	In regard to the World Championships in Tashkent, RS advised that there was a team of 9 athletes – 7 women and 2 men, with the women especially having a good chance of medalling. Also Nekoda Davis-Smythe's comeback is going well, winning bronze at a European Open and she could still qualify for the Paris Olympics.  RS, AS and KR had a positive meeting with Bernard Richmond, BJC Chair, the previous week. Various items were discussed concluding in the suggestion that a Forum be created for all judo associations where	



	minimum requirements are agreed especially in the current environment, with the publication of the Whyte Report. The Board discussed the potential implications of the report and how British Judo should review the recommendations and apply where necessary. Board members were in agreement with these proposals.

61.9	CHIEF EXECUTIVE'S UPDATE	
	AS commenced with the resignation of Nikki Patel and that Sara Heath is looking at the structure of the department and once job descriptions, pay bands and how to resource the new structure had been completed, this would be circulated to Board for comment.	
	Also, on staffing, looking into appointing tutors to alleviate some of the weekend workload on Regional Support Officers.

	Date of Tuesday 1 November has been agreed for the Home Nations meeting. One area for discussion will be the funding of the British Championships and location so not always in England.	
	As per an action from the last meeting, AS had provided more information on the Net Promoter Score from the Culture Health Check. This showed that up to 8 is low or neutral which participants are unlikely to be aware of and would have believed they were giving a high score.	
	AS then advised that an allowance of 0.1kg had been added to minors weight tolerance, this was to allow them to wear a t-shirt and would apply to Levels 2 to 4 on the competition structure.	
	Decision: The new weight tolerance allowance was fully approved by the Board

	AS concluded by advising that he has now been provided with the Paris Olympics ticket information.	
61.10	FINANCE & OPERATIONS UPDATE	
	AS advised there would be a full Q2 review at the Audit & Risk Meeting on Thursday 20 October and that work on re-forecasting for the last 6 months of the year had already commenced.	
	On income, AS advised that this is almost where it had been forecast to be, however the 4-month membership extension provided previously is having an impact, as well as the CRM implementation and cost of living crisis. SE have now advised that the Together Fund can be used to	



	address the cost of living for clubs and members. Also, BJC clubs can	
	now apply to the Together Fund.

61.11	DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR UPDATE	
	KR's report taken as read. KR updated on the following points.	
	KR advise she had spent most of her first few weeks gathering an understanding of all the aspects of the role and building relationships with her new team. Also, recruitment has started for 2 Club Support Officers (CSO).	
	On the technical side, looking at bringing in the technical aspects in Performance into coaching. Also, meeting with CIMPSA to map across the qualifications.	
	The IJF practical assessment week had been very successful and we will be putting in an expression of interest to host this again next year. This is financially beneficial to British Judo as hosting reduces travel and hotel costs for UK participants.	
	The Together Fund has highlighted that there is a lot of positive activity and once the CSOs are recruited they will be helping with community growth and supporting clubs/Areas with their development plans and looking to finalise the Area Partnership Agreements. Having feet on the ground again will provide the support needed to get awareness out on how British Judo and the Together Fund can assist.	
	One reflection on the strategy was the lack of reference to coaches but this could be incorporated into the actions put in place to deliver the strategy. This will be raised at an Events Home Nations Meeting on Friday 18 November.	
	AS added that himself and KR would now also be visiting clubs on a monthly basis.	
	ASI then provided a brief overview on the Transgender Policy, advising that in essence, you have to compete in the gender assigned to you at birth unless you can absolutely prove it is safe for you and for your potential competitors for you not to. Safety is paramount. Judo recognises this as a sport with weight categories, which protects safety KR added that the Policy would be reviewed max every 2 years and that an FAQs document would be built over time.	
	KR moved on to the Mental Health & Wellbeing Action Plan and Strategy, advising that this is fluid. RS commented that the rollout of this was important as there was a lot of information to interpret. Look at having Mental Health First Aiders and Club Welfare Officers as events. Sami Smithson is working on the budget for rolling this out but will be clearer once advised of the level of SE funding to support this.

Also, PB's contribution would be noted and celebrated at a dinner on Friday 11 November.
