Introduction & Purpose:



A breach of this code of conduct by any member of our team may be considered misconduct, and result in disciplinary action in accordance with the British Judo Performance Programme Disciplinary Policy, or British Judo Employee Disciplinary policy and procedure.

British Judo Performance Programme Fighter Agreement

Whilst at International & Domestic Competitions & Training Camps,

- 1. Strictly adhere to all curfews and meeting times.
- 2. Not enter another fighter's room.
- 3. Not purchase or consume alcohol.
- 4. Follow the laws and expectations/culture of the countries they are visiting.
- 5. Maintain a tidy living and training environment.
- 6. Stay in the Competition Venue or Accommodation Complex unless give permission by the lead coach.
- 7. Wear England Talent Clothing when travelling and attending international events.
- 8. Follow the rules and regulations of the competition organiser, IJF & EJU.
- 9. Adhere to requests by Staff and Coaching Team.
- 10. Show respect to others involved in the sport including competition officials, fighters, coaches, managers, and spectators.

At All Times,

- 1. Follow guidance provided by British Judo with weight management.
- 2. Not participate in any activity that is against the Laws of the United Kingdom.
- 3. Use social media in a way that positively promotes yourself, other fighters, and the British Judo Association.
- 4. Not to share inappropriate images of others (or themselves) on social media
- 5. Not Engaging in the bullying or harassment of others
- 6. Not bringing British Judo or England Talent into any situation which impacts on its reputation.
- 7. Comply with Anti-Doping rules and regulations of UKAD and WADA.
- 8. Being a positive impact on the sport of judo by maintaining the behaviours outlined in the BJA Values and GB Judo Way (Code of Conduct)

Additional Elements,

- 1. I will maintain my BJA License.
- 2. Agree to the BJA using my name and image in promotional materials, marketing, advertising and merchandising, during my involvement in the Performance Programme, without charge. Further, I agree to the use of my name and image in a factual context, following the end of my involvement in the Performance Programme.

The British Judo Association reserves the right to refer a matter to the Sport Integrity Service under the Rules of Procedure of that service. This may involve the commission of an independent investigation or disciplinary procedure into alleged grievances, or allegations of misconduct involving: i) athletes; ii) athlete support personnel; or iii) British Judo's office holders as defined within the Rules of Procedure;

- i. where an individual is deemed a 'Relevant Person' under the terms of the Sport Integrity Service Rules of Procedure; and
- ii. they are a respondent to allegations of misconduct as defined as a 'Relevant Matter' under the same regulations.

Relevant Persons are:

- i. an Athlete who is selected to British Judo's WCP funded by UK Sport;
- ii. athlete support personnel who are either working on the UK Sport funded WCP (in whatever capacity) or working with Athletes; and
- iii. office holders of the British Judo Association.
